## 2012 Summer Reading for Rising Randolph 5<sup>th</sup> Graders

Summer reading is so important! Randolph's curriculum works best when it builds upon what parents are doing at home. We want our children to return after the summer ready to read, write and learn. When students see that parents and teachers believe in the value of reading, they are more apt to feel the same way.

Students who love to read will see success in school. This begins at home where students are encouraged to read, their parents set an example of reading in front of them, and their parents read aloud to them. Becoming a good reader takes practice. Offer your children quiet times and good places to enjoy reading. Read aloud to them on a regular basis - students whose parents do so perform better on standardized tests, have larger vocabularies, and find more success in all subjects.

This summer, we ask rising 5<sup>th</sup> graders to read **two fiction books** from our suggested reading list, library, bookstore, or family bookshelf which you feel is appropriate. They also must read **one non-fiction book** (any selection they find at the public library or bookstore.) When students return to school, they will bring completed reading logs (provided in this document) of the two fiction books, the non-fiction book, any additional books read by the student, and books read aloud to them by a parent.

#### Guidelines for Non-Fiction Reading:

The non-fiction book selection for summer reading may include: History, Nature, Geography, Science, Technology, Current Events, Biography, or Poems.

#### Choose a non-fiction book:

- Which you are interested in please don't choose something to impress parents or teachers!
- Connected to an activity you enjoy or have experienced.
- Which has good pictures, tables, graphics, and captions.
- Which seems readable not too simple, nor too complicated.

Reading a non-fiction book is a different process, so please remember...

- It is okay to just read some sections of the book.
- It is okay to read the chapters or sections out of order.
- It is okay to read the Table of Contents in the front to decide which sections you want to review/read.
- It is okay to check the glossary in the back of the book (or a dictionary) if you don't know the meaning of a word.

The 5<sup>th</sup> grade team sincerely looks forward to working with you and your child this coming year. With your help, we can fulfill Randolph's mission statement of: **Seeking Truth, Building Character, Nurturing All**.
