What is Grief?

Grief is a strong, sometimes overwhelming emotion for people, regardless of whether their sadness stems from the loss of a loved one or from a terminal diagnosis they or someone they love have received.

People who are grieving might find themselves feeling numb and removed from daily life, unable to carry on with regular duties while saddled with their sense of loss. Grief is the natural reaction to loss. Grief is both a universal and a personal experience. Individual experiences of grief vary and are influenced by the nature of the loss.

Anger: "Why is this happening? Who is to blame?"

Bargaining: "Make this not happen, in return I will

Acceptance: "I'm at peace with what happened."


Community Bible Baptist Church in Prince George's County, Maryland. After serving eight years as a licensed minister, he was ordained in September 2009.

#### Historical Highlights of the African Methodist Espicopal Church

The African Methodist Episcopal Church was an outgrowth of the Free African Society which Richard Allen, Absalom Jones and other free blacks established in 1787, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The denomination was formed to unite congregations of African descent who felt unwelcome and experienced racial prejudice in White-dominated Churches. Limitations and restrictions were placed on the congregants that caused tension and prohibited them from religious freedom during worship. Rev. Richard Allen, a Methodist Preacher, felt that the doctrine of the Methodist Church and the traditions of John Wesley were best for the people. In 1816, during a conference, he was elected and consecrated as the first Bishop.

The focus of the AME Church has always been on ministering to the spiritual, social, emotional, intellectual, and environmental needs of the people. Before slavery was abolished, most AME congregations were found in Philadelphia, New York City, Boston, Pittsburg, Baltimore, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Chicago, and Washington, D.C. By the 1850s, the AME Church had reached San Francisco, Stockton, and Sacramento, California. After the Civil War, the AME Church increased tremendously in the south. However, according to some historians, the African Methodist Episcopal Church sprang up in Mobile, Alabama as early as 1820, but was crushed by the elements of slavery. It did not resurface again until 1864, when Rev. J. P. Campbell and Rev. M.M. Clark visited and preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the name of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. In 1867, missionaries were appointed to Alabama by Bishop Alexander Washington Wayman, the

Presiding Prelate of Georgia. In May 1868, Alabama was set apart as the 7<sup>th</sup> Episcopal District, and the first Bishop was Rev. John M. Brown who was a newly elected Bishop. The first Annual Conference was held in Selma, Alabama, and there were six churches, thirty-one missions with an estimated membership of 5,617. In 1872, Bishop Thomas M.D. Ward was the Presiding Prelate and held his first conference in Selma, AL. By this time, the number of churches had increased and the membership had almost doubled.

By 1877, the Alabama conference had grown to the point that it was felt that there needed to be another conference established. So, on December 11, 1878, at the courthouse in Florence, AL., the North Alabama Conference was organized. Bishop Jabez Pitts Campbell presided. In 1879, or 1880, as stated in some documents, Bishop Alexander Washington Wayman was assigned to Alabama. In May, 1884, the senior Bishop Daniel Alexander Payne, who was an Apostle of Christian Education and celebrated lecturer was assigned to the 7th Episcopal District, which included Alabama and Florida. In 1888, Alabama was removed from the 7th Episcopal District with Florida and became a part of the 6th Episcopal District which included Georgia. Bishop Wesley John Gaines was the assigned Prelate. In November 1889, Payne Institute opened in Selma, Alabama. There were three teachers and 89 students on the first day. The slogan adopted by the fathers of the early church was, we must "Educate or We Perish." In December 1890, a resolution was passed to make a 3rd conference in the State of Alabama due to the growth of the AMEC. The Central Alabama Conference was organized in 1892, and the 1st session was held in Demopolis, AL. Bishop Abram Grant was the Presiding Prelate of the 6th District which was composed of Georgia and Alabama. Bishop Henry M. Turner held his first conference in Greensboro, AL in November, 1896. Sis. Lillian Thurman, a female was allowed to preach during this session of the annual conference. At the General Conference in Columbus, OH, in May 1900, Alabama was detached from Georgia and attached to South Carolina becoming the 7th Episcopal District. Bishop Wesley J. Gaines was assigned as Bishop. This was the second time Bishop Gaines had presided over Alabama. In 1904, Bishop Levi J. Coppin came to preside over Alabama. Legend reveals that a community in Geneva County was named in his honor because of his influence and powerful preaching.

It was under Bishop Coppin's leadership that the East Alabama Conference was organized. In 1908, at the General Conference in Norfolk, VA, Alabama was combined with Tennessee to form the 12th Episcopal District. Bishop Henry B. Parks served from 1908-1912. In 1912, the 9th Episcopal District was created at the General Conference in Kansas City, MO. Bishop Joshua H. Jones was assigned as the Presiding Prelate and served from 1912 to 1916. During his tenure in 1914, the South Alabama Conference was organized. In 1916, Bethel College was established on the edge of Montgomery, AL. The Presiding Prelate of the 7th Episcopal District, Alabama and South Carolina from 1916-1922 was Bishop Benjamin F. Lee. By 1920, Alabama became the 9th Episcopal District by action of the General Conference and has remained an Episcopal District since that time. During the early 1920s, the West Conference was organized and reorganized and all have worked together to serve and make tremendous contributions to Alabama to the extent that the limitations of this document will not allow to be shared. To God Be the Glory!

#### Acts of Hope by Bishop Richard Allen

- LEADER: O my God, in all my dangers temporal and spiritual I will hope in Thee who art Almighty power, and therefore able to relieve me, who art infinite goodness, and therefore ready and willing to assist me.
- CHURCH: O precious blood of my dear Redeemer! O gaping wounds of my crucified Savior!

  Who can contemplate the sufferings of God incarnate, and not raise their hope, and not put their trust in Christ?
- LEADER: What though my body be crumbled into dust, and that dust blown over the face of the earth, yet I undoubtedly know my Redeemer lives, and shall raise me up at the last day;
- CHURCH: Whether I am comforted or left desolate; whether I enjoy peace or am afflicted with temptations, whether I am healthful or sickly, succored or abandoned by the good things of this life, I will always hope in Thee my Lord, O my chief, infinite good.
- LEADER: Although the fig-tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; although the labor of the olive shall fail, and the fields yield no meat; although the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation.
- CHURCH: What though I mourn and am afflicted here, and sigh under the miseries of this world for a time, I am sure that my tears shall one day be turned into joy, and that joy none shall take from me.
- LEADER: Whoever hopes for the great things in this world, and takes no pains to attain them; how can my hopes of everlasting life be well ground, if I do not strive and labor for that eternal inheritance? I will never refuse the meanest labors, while I look to receive such glorious wages; I will never repine at any temporal loss, while I expect to gain such eternal rewards.
  - ALL: Blessed Hope!!! Be Thou my chief delight in life, and then I shall be steadfast and immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord. Be thou my comfort and support unto the very hour of death, and then shall I contentedly leave this world, and embrace you of God in Christ, as my supreme Hope.



#### Rev. Jeffery B. Cooper, D. Min.

Jeffery B. Cooper is a native of Savannah, GA and a lifelong member of St. Phillip AME church, the Mother Church of African Methodism in the State of Georgia.

Rev. Cooper attended the public schools of Savannah, Georgia. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and a Master's degree in Public Administration from the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia. He holds an M.A. degree in Practical Theology from Regent University School of Divinity in Virginia Beach, Virginia and a Doctor of Ministry from Graduate Theological Seminary in South Bend, Indiana. Rev. Cooper holds a certificate in theology from the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia and has done further study at the University Of Georgia School Of Law and Emory's Candler School of Theology in Atlanta, Georgia.

Rev. Cooper received his first pastoral charge while a student at the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia. This assignment was to Siloam A.M.E. Church in Siloam, Georgia from 1978-79. He then served at St. Luke/Nimno A.M.E.



Church in Athens, Georgia, in the Augusta Conference from 1979-80. In December of 1980, Rev. Cooper was sent to Greater Bethel A.M.E. Church in Athens, Georgia. During his tenure the church membership grew, the mortgage was burned, renovations were made to the church structure, and the Annual Conference was hosted. Rev. Cooper also served as secretary to the Conference and, following the passing of Presiding Elder J. F. Booker, for a brief period served as acting Presiding Elder.

In June of 1988, Trinity A.M.E. Church in Atlanta, Georgia received Rev. Cooper as its 36th Pastor. During his 24 year tenure, the church property was renovated, a one million dollar state of the art Day care center was built and a house was purchased and converted into an enrichment center for the church and community.

Rev. Cooper has served as a consultant to the United States Central Intelligence Agency Personnel Department, a member of the General Board of the African Methodist Episcopal Church (1984-1988), and as the Assistant Director of Admissions / Director of Minority Admissions at the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia (1984-1995). He has served as a member of the Board of Trustees for Turner Theological Seminary at the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia as well as the Board of Trustees for the Sixth Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Church. Rev. Cooper served as secretary of the Augusta Georgia Annual Conference (1981-1988). Rev. Cooper has served as a member of the Board of Examiners of the Atlanta North Georgia Annual Conference as well as a member of the Atlanta North Georgia Conference Board of Trustees. Rev. Cooper has served as Chair of the Credentials committee for the General Conference of the A.M.E. Church (2004 & 2008). Rev. Cooper has also served as the accountant for the Sixth Episcopal District. He is also the author of the book, A Financial Management Primer for the AME Church, which is used in the training of ministers by the A.M.E. Board of Examiners.

Rev. Cooper is married to Joanne E. Williams-Cooper, M.D. and they are the proud parents of four children: Ako, Ethan, Charity and Jeffery, II. They have also been blessed with three adorable grandchildren: Alex, Jadore, and Imana.


