

**LEADER:** So Faith, Hope, Love abide these three.





Cry aloud, spare not, lift up your voice like a trumpet, and show My people their transgression, and the house of Jacob their sins.

Then shall your light break forth as the morning, and your health shall spring forth speedily: and your righteousness shall go before you; the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard.

Then shall you call, and the Lord shall answer; you shall cry, and He shall say, Here I am. If you take away from the midst of you the yoke, the putting forth of the finger, and speaking vanity;

If you draw out your soul to the hungry, and satisfy the afflicted soul; then shall your light rise in obscurity, and your darkness be as the noonday:

The Lord shall guide you continually, and satisfy your soul in drought, and you shall be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters, fail not.

They that shall be of you shall build the old waste places: you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; and you shall be called, the repairer of the breach, the restorer of paths to dwell in.



# "We are living Building Stones" I Peter 2:4-10

A Salute to African-American Males

**LEADER:** Come to Christ, who is the living Foundation of Rock upon which God builds; though men have spurned him, he is very precious to God who has chosen him above all others.

**PEOPLE:** And now you have become living building stones for God's use in building his house. What more, you are his holy priests; so come to him (you who are acceptable to him because of Jesus Christ) and offer to God those things that please him.

LEADER: As the Scriptures express it, "See, I am sending Christ to be the carefully chosen, precious Cornerstone of my church, and I will never disappoint those who trust him."

**PEOPLE:** Yes, he is very precious to you who believe; and to those who reject him, well-- The same stone that was rejected by the builders has become the Cornerstone, the most honored and important part of the building.

**LEADER:** And the Scriptures also say, "He is the Stone that some will stumble over, and the rock that will make them fall." They will stumble because they will not listen to God's Word, nor obey it, and so this punishment must follow--that they will fall.

**PEOPLE:** But you are not like that, for you have been chosen by God himself-you are priests of the King, you are holy and pure, you are God's very own-all this so that you may show others how God called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

LEADER: Once you were less than nothing; now you are God's own. Once you knew very little of God's kindness; now your very lives have been changed by it.

### OUR SPEAKER

U.W. Clemon is Alabama's first black federal judge. He is a graduate of the public schools of Jefferson County, Alabama; Miles College, and Columbia University Law School. He has done further legal studies at the University of Michigan, the University of Wisconsin, and Harvard University.

Before his appointment to the federal bench by President Jimmy Carter in 1980 to the Northern District of Alabama, he was a civil rights lawyer specializing in job discrimination and school desegregation cases. In 1974, he was one of the first two blacks elected to the Alabama State Senate since Reconstruction. During his first term, he chaired the Rules Committee; and during his second term, he was chairman of the Judiciary Committee

He holds an honorary doctorate degree from Miles College; was the recipient of the 1980 Drum Major Award of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. In 1986, he was given the highest honor of the National Bar Association. . .The C. Francis Stradford Award. Most recently, the black judges of the United States gave him their William H. Hastie Award, "in recognition of his exceptional legal scholarship."

He is married to the former Barbara L. Lang; and he is the father of two children.

He is an alternate member of the Judicial Council of the African Methodist Episcopal Church; and he is a trustee and treasurer of Jones Chapel AME Church, Birmingham.

Fraternally, he is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, the Shriners, and The Prince Hall 33 degree Masons.

He serves as adjunct Professor of Constitutional Law at Birmingham-Southern College.



LEADER: "Men of the African-American race, let me say to you that a greater future is in store for us; we have no cause to lose hope, to become faint-hearted."

PEOPLE: "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage."

LEADER: "We must realize that upon ourselves depend our destiny, our future; we must carve out that future, that destiny, and we who make up . . . this church . . . have pledged ourselves that nothing in the world shall stand in our way, nothing in the world shall discourage us, but opposition shall make us work harder, shall bring us closer together so that as one man . . . we . . . will march on toward that goal we have set for ourselves."

PEOPLE: "For we through the Spirit wait for the hope of righteousness by faith."

LEADER: "The new . . . African-American shall not be deceived. The new . . . African-American refuses to take advice from anyone who has not felt with him, and suffered with him."

PEOPLE: "I have confidence in you through the Lord, that ye will be none otherwise minded: but he that troubleth you shall bear his judgement, whosoever he be."

LEADER: "We have suffered for three hundred (plus) years, therefore we feel that the time has come when only those who have suffered with us can interpret our feelings and our spirit."

PEOPLE: "For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only USE not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another."

LEADER: "It takes the slave to interpret the feelings of the slave; it takes the unfortunate man to interpret the spirit of his unfortunate brother; and so it takes the suffering . . . African-American to interpret the spirit of his comrade."

PEOPLE: "For all the law is fulfilled in one word, EVEN in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. THIS I say then. Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh."

LEADER: "It is strange that so many people are interested in the . . . African-American now, willing to advise him how to act, and what organizations he should join, yet nobody was interested in the . . . African-American to the extent of not making him a slave for (at least) two hundred and fifty years, reducing him to industrial peonage and serfdom after he was freed;"

PEOPLE: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith. Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."

LEADER: "It is strange that the same people can be so interested in the . . . African-American now, as to tell him what organization he should follow and what leader he should support."

PEOPLE: "If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another."

LEADER: "Whilst we are bordering on a future of brighter things, we are also at our danger period, when we must either accept the right philosophy, or go down by following deceptive propaganda which has hemmed us in for many centuries."

ALL: "Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ. Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also heap. And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."

AMEN.



## LEGISLATIVE EXPERIENCE/ACCOMPLISHMENTS

## THE HONORABLE EARL F. HILLIARD

. . . Was elected the first Chairman of the Alabama Black Legislative Caucus in 1975 and was elected to the Alabama State Senate in 1980 and was re-elected to the Alabama State Senate in 1982, 1983, 1986, and 1990. He was Chairman of Senate Commerce, Transportation and Utility Committee from 1990 to 1992. Was Chairman of the Jefferson County Senate Delegation in 1986 and re-appointed in 1990. He was Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee from 1982 to 1986. Sponosored the Flouride Bill and the Tax Abatement Bill. He was the Senate sponsor of the Horse Track Bill which created hundreds of jobs for residents of Birmingham, Alabama. Sponsored legislation that allowed Alabama State, Alabama A&M and Tuskegee Universities more money, percentage-wise than ever before. He created a scholarship program for low-income youths to attend Lawson State Community College, Tuskegee University, and Miles College. (Over 400 students have been enrolled in the program.) Included in the Education Budget over \$250,000 extra for the Birmingham Board of Education for the last eight (8) years. Directed \$118,000 to be used for the Civil Rights Museum in Birmingham. He donated funds to North Pratt Library, Carver High School, Jackson-Olin High School and North Pratt Historical Society and increased financial aid to the University of Alabama at Birmingham and Talladega College. Sponsored legislation in the form of a resolution renaming Highway 150 in Bessemer in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Congressman Hilliard was elected to the House of Representatives in 1992. He serves the 7th Congressional District of Alabama and is presently serving on the Committee on Small Business and the Committee on Agriculture. In addition, he serves on the Congressional Rural Caucus, the Congressional Travel and Tourism Caucus, Forestry 2000 Task Force and the Congressional Arts Caucus.

#### TITHING IS GOD'S ANSWER TO CHURCH FINANCE

The Principle of Tithing: Tithing is taught through the Bible.

- GOD is sovereign of the universe and is owner of all things (Genesis 1:1, Psalm 24:1, John 1:3-11
- HE has made man a steward or trustee (Ecclesiastes 5:18-19, Acts 17:28, James 1:17
- Man is therefore accountable to GOD (Philippians 2:10, Luke 16:1-2, Romans 14:10-12, Matthew 12:36

#### The Preaching of Tithing:

- It is the responsibility of every proclaimer of GOD'S word to preach about tithing. CHRIST'S disciples are ordered to preach the Word (Mark 16:15, Matthew 28:19-20)
- Tithing must be fully preached, clearly explained and the definites pointed out (II Timothy 4:2, Titus 2:15).
- 1. A DEFINITE Person. Who does GOD hold responsible for tithing? The answer is every Christian (II Corinthians 9:6-7). Tithing is a Christian's privilege and responsibility.
- 2. A DEFINITE Sequence of Giving. II Corinthians 8:1-15 stipulates the GOD ordered sequence of giving. There we are told that the Macedonians "First gave themselves, then their money." Giving to GOD is an act of worship (Isaiah 60:6, Matthew 2:11).
- 3. A DEFINITE Proportion. The Bible is clear in its teachings that 10% (Genesis 28:22, Leviticus 27:32) of the Christian's income is "Holy unto GOD" (Leviticus 27:30).
- 4. A DEFINITE Place. Malachi 3:10 states that tithes are to be brought into the storehouse. Also Malachi 3:10, GOD refers to this storehouse as "My house." This storehouse is your local congregation (Deuteronomy 12:10-14, Deuteronomy 26:1-4).
- 5. A DEFINITE Time. When are we to bring tithes to the storehouse? I Corinthians 16:2 tells us, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as GOD has prospered him."
- 6. A DEFINITE Purpose. By tithing Christians demonstrate their love for the SAVIOR (John 14:15, I John 5:3). By tithing Christians demonstrate that they are truly a spiritual being (John 6:63, I Corinthians 2:12-14). By tithing a Christian shows tangible evidence of their interest in the CHURCH and GOD'S KINGDOM Work (Matthew 12:30, Malachi 3:8). GOD wants meat in HIS storehouse (Malachi 3:10). By tithing the Christian places himself in position for receiving the personal blessings, which GOD has promised him (Malachi 3:10-12). By not tithing the Christian places himself in position for receiving judgment (Malachi 3:8-9, Haggai 1:3-9).

#### The Practice of Tithing:

- Unfortunately, untold numbers of professing Christians still continue to rob GOD (Malachi 3:8). Many problematic excuses are offered for this:
- Some say that "tithing is legalistic" (part of the Old Testament, therefore not applicable
  in these New Testament times).
- Some say, "I'm in so much debt, that I cannot afford to tithe." The answer is, very logically, to whom do you owe the most? (Acts 17:28, Psalm 116:12-14, James 1:17, Genesis 1:26-30).

• Others say, "after I pay my bills, I don't have anything left." The answer would be, you started wrong; begin with GOD (Deuteronomy 26:1-4, Genesis 1:1, John 1:1).

#### The Beginner Tither:

The beginner tither is in for at least four (4) pleasant surprises:

FIRST: At the deepening of your own spiritual life, as a result of tithing.

SECOND: At the ease with which you meet your other obligations with the nine tenths.

THIRD: At the amount of money you will have PLUS the tenth for GOD'S work.

FOURTH: At the ease in going from one tenth to larger giving.



## Litany For Men's Day

LEADER:	Faith is the avenue to salvation. Not intellectual understanding. Not money. Not works. Just simple faith.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.		
LEADER:	How much faith? The faith of a mustard seed, so small you can hardly see it.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.		
LEADER:	But if you will put that little faith in the person of Jesus, your life will be changed.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.		
LEADER:	He will come with supernatural power into your heart. It can happen to you.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness:for they shall be filled.		
LEADER:	We have the God-given ability to believe, to have faith-in God, in ourselves, and in our fellow man.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.		
LEADER:	Christ has told us "according to your faith, be it unto you." What a wonderful promise in those words.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.		
LEADER:	We have only to put our problems before Him with a humble and faithful heart and to believe with the simple faith of a little child, and we are promised His guidance and help.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.		
LEADER:	If our problems are big, then our prayers should be equally big! And the minute we believe that he has answered our prayers, they have been answered, perhaps not as we wanted or expected, but answered nevertheless. And they are right answers, too.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.		
LEADER:	Both faith and faithfulness are closely connected together. Faith is that indefinable power whereby we realize things unseen.		
PEOPLE:	Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.		

LEADER: It seems to me that unless we possess faith, then faithfulness is impossible. We can only be true and faithful in out relationship to things spiritual, as we have faith in the reality of these things.

PEOPLE: Rejoice, and be exceedingly glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.

LEADER: The best of us must confess that we are not as faithful to Him as we should be. Is the Master disappointed in your allegiance to Him? Are we more faithful to others than to Him? Are you more concerned of what people thing of you than His judgment will be?

PEOPLE: Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savor, where-with shall it be salted? It is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men.

LEADER: "He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much." Let us observe what our Lord says: It is not he that is faithful in that which is least will become faithful also in much, but is faithful in much.

PEOPLE: Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid.

LEADER: Acts of faithfulness are the golden threads which make the luster of a fruitful life. There is unity in such a life. It is a life consecrated through and through.

PEOPLE: Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

LEADER: Every act of faithfulness is the outburst and expression of the Life of the Spirit. They are like precious stones which the soul builds into its habitation for eternity. Our life is not made up of sudden bursts of inspiration, but of progressive efforts of daily fidelity. Even as the pasture land is made up of blades of grass, so the qualities of a faithful life, the solid strength of character, is not the outcome of one act but the result of a life of self-restraint.

PEOPLE: Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.





#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

William P. DeVeaux was born to Chaplain John and Della DeVaux in Fort Huachuca Arizona. Upon graduation from high school, he entered Howard University. An active student, he was elected junior and senior class president and Basileus of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. While a student at Howard, he answered the call to the ordained ministry. Following in his father's footsteps he served in the United States Army as a Chaplain. In the midst of enemy fire, he brought comfort and solace to troops in combat during the Viet Nam Conflict.

In addition to a bachelor's degree from Howard University, he attained a Bachelor of Scared Theology from Boston University as well as a Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy from Vanderbilt University. He has served on the faculties of Meharry Medical College. Princeton Theological Seminary and Howard University School of Divinity.

In the field of theological education, Bishop DeVeaux is recognized for his achievements as the Executive Director of the Fund for Theological Education inc. During his tenure, scholarships to Black, Hispanic and North American students were granted to support their theological education.

His career as a minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church includes pastorates at Bethel A. M. E. Church in Lynn MA, St John A. M. E. Church in Nashville, TN; Wayman A. M. E. Church in Dayton, OH and Metropolitan A. M. E. Church in Washington, DC. He served at Metropolitan from 1986 until his election to the office of Bishop. Using his personal leadership style, academic expertise and his diverse ministerial experience, Bishop DeVeaux energized the church membership into active participants in community outreach efforts.

On July 2, 1996 the Reverend William P. Devaux was consecrated as the 113<sup>th</sup> Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in Louisville Kentucky and was assigned to Southern Africa where he lived and served for four years. He serves now as the presiding Bishop of the 16<sup>th</sup> Episcopal District of the AME Church which includes the following conferences: Guyana/Suriname, Windward Islands, Virgin Islands, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Jamaica, and London/Holland. Bishop DeVeaux is the Chairman of Global Witness and Ministries for the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Bishop DeVeaux and Dr. Pam DeVeaux are the parents of five children and they have eleven grandchildren. Bishop DeVeaux remains steadfast in his belief that he can best serve Jesus by, "Ordering his steps in the Lord."

# Men's Day Litany Theme: "Christian Men Leading in Worship Through Prayer"

Leader:	Prayer, to the patriarchs and prophets, was more than the recital of well known and well-worn phrases it was the outpouring of the heart. Beset by perils, persecutions, pain and privations, they naturally turned to God in their need, believing that He was able to redeem them out of all their troubles.
People:	Hear, O Lord and answer us, for we are poor and needy. Guard our lives, for we are devoted to you. You are our God; save your servants who trust in you.
Leader:	If the elders knew little of the philosophy of prayer, they certainly knew a great deal about its' power, as our meditation upon the Word reveals.
People:	Have mercy upon us, O Lord; for we call to you all day long, Bring joy to your servants, for to you, O Lord, we lift up our souls.
Leader:	What is Prayer? Simplified, is it not the desire, opportunity and privilege of talking to God? Prayer is "a correspondence fixed with heaven." With the creation of man, prayer was a dictate to nature, "a constitutioned instinct, inwrought by the Maker."
People:	You are forgiving and good, O Lord, abounding in love to all who call on you, for you will answer us. Among the gods there is none like you; O Lord' no deeds can compare with yours.
Leader:	What the coming of Enos, men were conscious of their weakness, and seeking refuge in "God, wished to be distinguished as men who feared the Lord God, and who desired to do His will. A sacredness, previously unknown, was now attached to the name Jehovah.
People:	All the nations you have made will come and worship before you, O Lord, and they will bring glory to your name. For you are great and do marvelous deeds; you alone are God.
Leader:	Worship, communion and promise are all bound up in God's call to Abraham, and in his calling upon the name of the Lord. How Abraham replied to the revelation he received, we are not told. However, within the Covenant given to Abraham there was the underlying thought that true family life is dependent upon family recognition of God.
People:	Teach us your way, O Lord, and we will walk in your truth; give us an undivided heart, that we may fear your name. We will praise you, O Lord, our God, with all our hearts; we will glorify your name forever.
Leader:	All God's people are praying people. Intercessory prayer is the first recorded prayer in form, and was a plea for a father on behalf of his child. It was a prayer asking for more than God had offered to bestow. It was a prayer receiving an immediate answer.
People:	For great is your love toward us; you have delivered us from the depths of the grave. The arrogant are attacking us, O God; a band of ruthless men seeks our lives-men without regard for you.
Leader:	Intercessory prayer, however, proves the benevolence of good men; the importance of the righteous to a wicked world; the kindness of God towards the guilty; the humility which should ever characterize prayer; and the efficacy of intercessory prayer.
People:	But you, O Lord, are a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness. Turn to us and have mercy upon us; grant your strength to your servants and save the sons of your maidservants.
Leader:	Too often we fail God and man because of our lack of desire for prevailing intercession-the costliest service a Christian can render. In sum, our prayers should be simple, direct, and childlike.
All:	Give us a sign of your goodness, that our enemies may see it and be put to shame, for you, O Lord, have helped us and comforted us. To God Be The Glory. Amen.  Composed by Lee E. Williams II, Ph. D

#### Dr. Dennis C. Dickerson

Dennis C. Dickerson, Executive Director of the Department of Research and Scholarship of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. In this capacity he is the Thirteenth Historiographer and the Thirteenth Editor of the A. M. E. CHURCH REVIEW. He is James M. Lawson, Jr. Professor of History and a member of the Faculty of the Graduate Department of Religion at Vanderbilt University. Born in McKeesport, Pennsylvania as the fourth and youngest son of Carl O'Neal Dickerson and Oswanna Wheeler Dickerson. He received the B. A. from Lincoln University, the M. A. and Ph.D from Washington University, M.Div. From Vanderbilt University. He did additional study at Hartford Seminary and Memphis Theological Seminary. Morris Brown College conferred upon him the honorary L. H. D.

His academic appointments have included teaching stints at Forest Park Community College in St. Louis, Missouri, Pennsylvania State University, Ogontz campus in Abington, Pennsylvania, and Rhodes College. He completed over twenty years at Williams College in Williamstown, Massachusetts beginning in 1976 where he rose from Assistant Professor

of History to the prestigious tenured post of Stanfield Professor of History and Chairman of the Department of History. He was visiting professor at Yale Divinity School and at Payne Theological Seminary. He is James M. Lawson, Jr. Professor of History at Vanderbilt University where he teaches courses on the Civil Rights Movement, Religion and the Civil Rights Movement, The Social History of American Medicine, and African American Religious History. He has been the recipient of grants and fellowships from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Lyndon B. Johnson Foundation and The American Council of Learned Societies. A Rockefeller Foundation Fellowship supported him as a visiting scholar at the Carter G. Woodson Institute at the University of Virginia.

Dr. Dickerson's extensive writings include out of the crucible: : Black Steel Workers in Western Pennsylvania, 1875-1980 (Albany, State University of New York Press, 1986) and Militant Mediator: Whitney M. Young, Jr.. (Lexington, University Press of Kentucky, 1998). His scholarly articles and book reviews have appeared in several anthologies and in such journals as PENNSYLVANIA HERITAGE, JOURNAL OF PRESBYTERIAN HISTORY, METHODIST HISTORY, JOURNAL OF UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST HISTORY, NEW JERSEY HISTORY, CHURCH HISTORY, THE NEW YORK STATE JOURNAL OF MEDICINE, JOURNAL OF SOUTHERN HISTORY, THE AMERICAN HISTORICAL REVIEW, and many others.

He was ordained into the ministry of the African Methodist Episcopal Church as an itinerant deacon and itinerant elder in the New York Annual Conference. On loan from the A. M. E. Church he served as interim minister at Second Congregational Church in Pittsfield, Massachusetts. He was pastor of Payne A. M. E. Church in Chatham, New York and St. Mark A. M. E. Church in Munford, Tennessee.

Dr. Dickerson was elected the Historiographer of the A. M. E. Church at the General Conference of 1988 meeting in Fort Worth, Texas. He was re-elected in 1992 in Orlando, Florida, in Louisville, Kentucky in 1996, and Cincinnati, Ohio in 2000 where he assumed duties as Executive Director of the Department of Research and Scholarship. He was re-elected in 2004 and in 2008.

He has written, THE PAST IS IN YOUR HANDS: WRITING LOCAL A. M. E CHURCH HISTORY (1989), RELIGION, RACE, AND REGION: RESEARCH NOTES ON A. M. E. CHURCH HISTORY (1995) and A LIBERATED PAST: EXPLORATIONS IN A. M. E. CHURCH HISTORY (2003). A trustee of the American Bible Society he served as senior consultant to the JUBILEE BIBLE to which he contributed as essay on the history of the black church.

He belongs to the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the World. He was initiated into the Nu Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity of October, 1968 at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania, the same chapter into where two of his three brothers were invited. Now he belongs to TAU Lambda Chapter in Nashville. He served in 2004 as President of the American Society of Church History and is Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the American Bible Society.

Dr. Dickerson is married to Mrs. Mary A. E. Dickerson, a graduate of the University of Memphis. She serves as the Subscriptions Manager for the A. M. E. CHURCH REVIEW. They are the parents of four children: Nicole, a graduate of Spelman College and Paralegal at a Nashville law firm. Valerie, a graduate of Spelman College and a PH.D candidate in Ethnomusicology at U. C. L. A., and Christina a graduate of Spelman College and a PH. D. Candidate in History at Vanderbilt University. His son, Dennis Jr., a graduate of the University of Memphis, a first year M. DIV. Student at Vanderbilt University Divinity School. His grandchildren, Melanie, Morgan, Devyn and Tavian are his pride and joy.
