God is good! From his early childhood Homer L. McCall I was encouraged and taught by his parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. Edward C. McCall, to "FAITHFULLY" seek first the Kingdom of God. Faith is God was alwaysthe top priority as the family gathered for reading the Bible at the family altar in the morning and for prayer before each meal. Many outstanding pastors, teachers and community leaders also impacted our pastor's life at an early age. A metamorphosis in his outlook on life (raison d'etre), his purpose for living, took place in 1951 as he began to yield to a lifelong destiny to serve God through serving people. Our pastor is a man of faith, where life is built upon the ROCK of Relying Upon Christ's Kingship. The home and church family that he and his lovely wife, Mable, the first lady of St. John, have built and led "by the grace of God" is a symbol to the church and community of the ancient appeal of Joshua: "Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve . . . For the cause of Christ then our pastor is willing to bear the cross, to live nobly, preach boldly in the Spirit, as well as to die unselfishly for the ONE who once taught, "But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself."

Dr. Montgomery has earned the following degrees: a Doctorate of Ministry, Trinity Theological Seminary, Newburgh, Indiana – Pastoral Ministries; Doctorate of Philosophy and Masters of Science degrees, Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana – Soil Genesis, Mineralogy,

Classification and Remote Sensing; and a Bachelor of Science Degree from Alabama A&M University, Huntsville, Alabama – Agronomy/Chemistry.



In 1976, Dr. Montgomery returned to Alabama A&M University (AAMU). During his 22-year tenure at AAMU, Dr. Montgomery has held several administrative positions with the University such as Director of External Affairs, Executive Assistant to the President for Institutional Advancement and Development, Director of Grants and Contracts, Vice President for Student Affairs, and Vice President of Research and Development.



BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Brother O. Wendell Davis was born in New Orleans, Louisiana and is a native of Gulfport, Mississippi. He is currently residing in Huntsville, Alabama, where he is the dynamic Pastor of Union Chapel Missionary Baptist Church and a disciple for Christ.

Pastor Davis received his undergraduate degree from Athens State University, Master of Science and Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry Degrees from Southern Christian University. Moreover, he has studied extensively at William Carey College, New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, Southern Baptist Sunday School Board, Calhoun Community College, Faulkner University, Liberty University and Alabama A. & M. University. He is listed in Who's Who Among Students in American Universities & Colleges.

He accepted Christ at the age of 24 and was called into the ministry the following year. He served as Pastor of Independent Missionary Baptist Church, Brooklyn, Mississippi from 1981-1986; Mount Calvary Missionary Baptist Church, Gulfport, Mississippi from 1986-1989 and Union Chapel Missionary Baptist Church from 1989 to present. He is a Bible Scholar, accomplished teacher, and a preacher of God's Word.

He served four years in the U.S. Army. Pastor Davis is affiliated with numerous religious and civic organizations. He serves as Dean of Union Chapel Bible College and instructor for the Alabama Baptist State Congress of Christian Education and National Baptist Congress of Christian Education.
