

Dee Bennett, Ph. D.

Dee Bennett is a native of Little Rock, Arkansas. She is married to Reverend Birttie Bennett, pastor of Greater Friendship Baptist Church, and is the mother of four children (two boys and two girls).

Mrs. Bennett attended Arkansas Baptist College, University of Wisconsin, University of Central Arkansas and the University of California; receiving degrees in Elementary and Secondary Education, Guidance and Counseling and Secondary Counseling. She received a Ph. D. in Psychology, using as her dissertation theme: THE TOTALITY OF THE CHURCH: "DEAL WITH THE WHOLE MAN."

Dr. Bennett has spent all of her adult life working in positions dealing with helping - giving - and - sharing with others. Presently, she is employed as a Psycho-Educational Consultant for Pulaski County Special School District, where her major task is helping young people with drug/alcohol related problems, to cope with stress in school and/or home, etc.

Dr. Bennett is a member of the Greater Friendship Baptist Church where she serves as Minister of Music. She serves on many boards and commissions geared toward helping the poor and underpriviledged. Naming only a few: Carver and Allen Young YMCA, Greater Little Rock Community Mental Health Advisory Board, Tri-District Council (geared toward helping school students and parents), "Say No to Drugs Council," and the North Little Rock City Planning Commission. Dr. Bennett is a member of the NAACP, Urban League, the North Little Rock Civic League and the Black Psychologists of America. She is State President of Operation PUSH (People United to Serve Humanity), and State Chairperson of the Jesse Jackson for President Campaign. She is also a candidate for the North Little Rock City Council as Alderman. If elected, she will be the first black elected to serve on the council. She ran for this office in 1984, and lost by 38 votes.

Dr. Bennett has traveled extensively throughout America and abroad, speaking particularly to young people, pointing out the fact that "They are Somebody!" In November, 1987, she visited Japan and Korea, sharing with others the goodness of the Lord!

Dr. Bennett's motto is: Giving - Sharing - Caring: Thus, Giving Back What God Has Given You!
