

### The Ideal Woman

From several observations we may construct a concept of the ideal woman. She is gracious, restrained in speech, discreet, peaceful (Prov. 9:13; 11:16, 22; 21:9). She is also trustworthy, efficient in the conduct of business, industrious, unafraid of the future, provident, wise, kind, and reverent (31:10-31). In the book of Judith the ideal woman is reverent, beautiful, intelligent, loyal (8:28-31, etc.). She forgets her modesty only to use her charm for the purpose of overcoming her people's enemy, Holofernes. Another writer names woman's grace, knowledge, silence, self-control, modesty, beauty, domestic efficiency, good figure, "beautiful feet with a steadfast heart" (Ecclus, 26:13-18). Susanna was a pious, chaste, and beautiful woman; and the piety of the mother of seven martyred sons is told in another story (II Macc. 7:20 ff). Young women should be trained to love their husbands and children, to be sensible, chaste, domestic, kind, and submissive to their husbands (Tit. 2:4). The ideal of patriotism, loyalty to the Jewish community, is strongly revealed in the book of Esther. The power of woman, idealized and rationalized, is brought out in the words of a young Persian attached to the court of Darius. He answered the question, What one thing is strongest? with the words: "Women are strongest." He explained that women bear men, nurture them, clothe them. Men give up a fortune looking for a woman, losing their heads for her (I Esd. 3:12).





### Favorite Bible Scriptures for Our Christian Growth

#### FAITH:

Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee. (Isaiah 26:3). . . Jesus said unto him, "If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth." (Mark 9:23). . . Then Jesus said unto them, "Because of your unbelief; for verily I say unto you, if ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove and nothing shall be impossible unto you." (Matthew 17:20). . . And Jesus said unto the centurion, "Go thy way and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee." And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour. (Matthew 8:13). . . Many sorrows shall be to the wicked: but he that trusteth in the Lord, mercy shall compass him about. (Psalm 32:10)

#### HOPE:

For the hope which is laid up for you in heaven, whereof ye heard before in the work of the truth of the gospel. (Colossians 1:5). . . Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. (I Peter 1:3). . . Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ. (Titus 2:13). . . And have hope toward God, which they themselves also allow that there shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust. (Acts 24:15).

#### LOVE

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have everlasting life. (John 3:16). . .
But God commended his love toward us in that, while we were yet sinners,

### Dr. Cleo Higgins

Now a widow, and the mother of two sons, Kyle Everett, and Sean Craig, Cleo S. Higgins was born in Memphis, Tennessee. She has five grandchildren.

Dr. Higgins is proud of her affiliation with Bethune Cookman College, and credits her preparation for teaching, leadership, and service, to several educational institutions and experiences. She graduated Salutatorian of a class of 565 students from DuSable High School, Chicago, Illinois; and later received a B.S. degree in English with Highest Honors from LeMoyne College, Memphis, Tennessee. The Ph. M. degree in English was received from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. She later received the Ph. D. degree in English and a minor in Educational Administration from the University of Wisconsin at Madison. During her study for the doctoral degree she won the distinction of Scholar in English.

Her career experiences extend from 1943 to the present. During this time she has taught many subjects in the field of Humanities, and has held several leader-ship positions in her profession, and received recognition for elevating the status of women in administration. She has held the office of Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of the Faculty at Bethune-Cookman College. Currently, she serves as Distinguished Professor of the institution. She plans to retire this year.

Dr. Higgins has won several scholarships, fellowships, grants, honors, and awards from many sources.

As early as 1940 she was named by the Chicago Tribune as one of the Leading Graduates in Chicago High Schools. She has been listed in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities; Who's Who in the South and Southwest; Outstanding Educators in America; Personalities of the South, and Community Leaders and Noteworthy Americans.

Dr. Higgins knew and worked with Mrs. Mary McCleod Bethune for eleven years!

Our speaker is an organizer of many educational, civic, social, and religious activities. She has served as Church School Superintendent; chaired a program on Bilingualism in the West Indies; consulted for In-Service Education; chaired a committee on Fair Employment Practices; held membership on a county Executive Board for the March of Dimes; served as Democratic Committeewoman in her community, and held the office of National President of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc.

Her list of memberships, services, and affiliations are more extensive than those listed here. However, we can conclude that Dr. Higgins is a Christian Woman, who has accomplished much in life. She serves diligently and efficiently the needs of humankind. It is doubtful that her concern and work for others will cease with her retirement on June 30 of this year.





These include: Lifetime member of Phi Beta Kappa, Delta of Georgia, Morehouse College; Lifetime member of Pi Lambda Theta, National Honor Society for Women in Education; Life member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; American Association of University Women; International Reading Association; Local and State Reading Association of Florida; Retired Teachers Association; Florida West Coast Symphony Association (Manatee Branch); Phi Delta Kappa; Women's Christian Fellowship of Bradenton; Church Women United (Bradenton), and Habitat for Humanity (Bradenton).

She has received awards for study and foreign travel from the Lilly Foundation and the Merrill Foundation. Other noteworthy awards were received from the United Negro College Fund.

Dr. Mitchell was recognized as Outstanding Teacher for three years by Morehouse College. She received a three year appointment to the Board of Directors of the International Reading Association, and she received the American Scholar Award from Phi Beta Kappa in 1987.

She is a volunteer for the Manatee County Library and a Lecturer and Reading Consultant.

Dr. Mitchell has traveled extensively to Africa, The Holy Land, Egypt, Australia, Hong Kong, Europe, New Zealand and the South Pacific Islands, Manila, Mexico, Canada, the Caribbean Islands, and Alaska.

She is the widow of the Late Rev. E. L. Mitchell, and mother of one daughter, Dr. Edwina M. Stanley.

## Annie Laura Vandiver Hall

ANNIE LAURA V. HALL, a native of Pendleton, South Carolina, is a Representative of House District 19, Alabama State Legislature. She has been representing District 19 since August of 1993. She has spent most of her life fighting to bring all people together.

Representative Hall received the Bachelor of Arts degree from Morris College, a Master's degree from Ohio State University, and Administrative Certification from Alabama A&M University. She has also studied at Atlanta University.

Representative Hall began fighting for unity and equal rights when she was a student at Morris College, because she was told by Rev. Fred James, now Presiding Bishop of the AME Church, "that as a student, she could not afford to not be involved in the fight for unity and equality." She brought her fight to Huntsville, Alabama in 1973, when she became employed as a science teacher at Johnson High School. Her equal treatment of students and colleagues alike caused her to immediately be elected chairperson of the science department, an office she held for several years.

She also took her plight to the community where she was elected the first Black female President of the Huntsville Education Association, where she made many accomplishments, including fighting for equal rights for support personnel. ## Rev. Dr. Renita J. Weems

The Rev. Dr. Renita J. Weems is a writer, minister, professor and widely acclaimed public speaker. The Atlanta, Ga., native received the bachelor's degree in economics from Wellesley College in Wellesley, Mass. Upon entering the ministry in 1979, she enrolled in Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, N. J., and subsequently earned the Master of Divinity (M.Div.) and Ph.D. cum laude. An ordained elder in the African Methodist Episcopal Church in 1984, Rev. Dr. Weems is an assistant professor of Old Testament at Vanderbilt University Divinity School in Nashville, Tennessee.

In addition to her teaching ministry, Rev. Weems is a writer with articles to her credit appearing in Essence, Ms., Sage, and the New York Times Book Review. A former contributing editor to Essence magazine, Dr. Weems is the author of two widely acclaimed books on women's spirituality and wholeness, Just a Sister Away and I Asked for Intimacy, both published by LuraMedia Publisher. As special recognition of her contribution as a scholar and writer, Rev. Weems was featured in the summer 1994 issue of Ms. magazine as one of 50 women across the country who represent the unique face of modern feminism because of her creative and critical contribution to her field. Her latest scholarly work includes writing the commentary on the book of "Song of Solomon" for the revised Interpreter's Bible series. This volume is scheduled to be published sometime next year with Abingdon Press. In addition, she has just completed a volume on marriage, sex and gender imagery in prophetic literature entitled Battered Love for Fortress Press.

Rev. Weems has spoken at several national conferences and on college campuses throughout the United States. Some of her most challenging and satisfying work lately, however, has been speaking and writing in the area of African American women's health issues, focusing on women and addiction, breast cancer and African American women, and human sexuality. She has been involved in studies of the toll disease and addiction takes on the family. This summer Rev. Weems was one of the featured speakers at the Tenth Anniversary Conference and Homecoming Celebration of the National Black Women's Health Project in Atlanta, Ga.

Besides her multi-faceted work, Rev. Dr. Weems is married to Rev. Martin L. Espinosa, pastor of Berean Baptist Church in Nashville, Tenn. They are the proud parents of one daughter, Savannah Nia.



Dr. Browning is a 1976 graduate of Boston University in Boston, Massachusetts with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Communications. She received a Master of Divinity Degree in 1986 and Doctorate of Ministry from Howard University School of Divinity in 1991 with emphasis in Church and Community. She received the Benjamin E. Mays Fellowship during her Master of Divinity program, the Pew-Fellowship during her Doctoral Studies and Who's Who Among American Colleges and Universities in 1989-90.

The Washingtonian Magazine featured Rev. Dr. Browning in July 1990, and the Howard University's Channel 32 Magazine featured her in 1994-both as a religious community leader. Ebony Magazine's Nov. 1997 issue listed Pastor Jo Ann Browning as honorable mention under the category of Outstanding African American Female Preacher. She participated in a National Broadcast on BET Live Online in 2001. Rev. Dr. Browning was the featured speaker for the co-sponsored, Heaven 1580 and Sister-to-Sister Business Women Conference Worship Service broadcasted live in October 2001. The Washington Post featured Rev. Drs. Browning in numerous articles and interviews—the latest occurring in February 2002.

Pastor Jo Ann Browning accepted the call to preach in 1982 at Hemmingway Memorial A.M.E. Church in Chapel Oaks, Maryland. Forty-two souls accepted Christ on that blessed occasion. In 1983 after serving for nine months on the Ministerial staff of St. Paul A.M.E. Church in Cambridge, MA., Rev. Dr. Jo Ann Browning accompanied her husband, Rev. Dr. Grainger Browning-who has been appointed as Pastor of the Ebenezer A.M.E. Church in Fort Washington, MD. Together, they began serving as a Pastoral Team. Since 1998, Bishop Vinton R. On September 18, 1994, the Ebenezer Church Family proudly held its first Worship Service in the newly constructed 3,000-seat Worship Center.

Rev. Dr. Jo Ann Browning, in addition to her responsibilities at Ebenezer, has had the opportunity to preach, teach and facilitate workshops at numerous churches throughout the United States, Haiti, Bermuda, Barbados and Germany. On November 10-17, 1996, The American Jewish Committee honored Dr. Browning by selecting her as a participant of the Project Interchange Program—an eight-day intensive travel seminar in Israel. She along with 11 other African American clergy from across the United States, took part in the seminar. In 2000, Maryland Governor Paris N. Glendening selected the Rev. Dr. Brownings as part of a historic delegation to South Africa for the purpose of dialoguing on economic development opportunities.

Pastor Jo Ann Browning is grateful for the opportunity to till new ground, tread in new territory and wade in new waters as she and her husband, Rev. Dr. Grainger Browning journey together in Pastoral Team Ministry. In all that has been said and done, Pastor Jo Ann Browning continuously gives God ALL THE PRAISE, HONOR AND GLORY FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO BE A HUMBLE SERVANT OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST!





Reverend Billips is proud of being a second-generation preacher and credits her success in ministry to her father who retired from and served over 50 years in the A.M.E. church, to her mother for being a spiritual guide and counselor and to her wonderful husband for his undying support.

Reverend Billips is a gifted and passionate preacher who has had the opportunity to share the Gospel in Texas, throughout the United States and Bermuda. Through her powerful preaching many souls have come to Christ and she has several sons and daughters in the ministry. Reverend Billips believes that she has been called to lead God's people to a higher place in Him, thus one of her favorite saying is, "You must go higher".

#### **Bishop Sarah Frances Davis**

The Right Reverend Sarah Frances Davis is the 126th elected and consecrated Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church (A.M.E. Church). Her historic election on July 6, 2004, makes her only the third woman in the 218-year history of the denomination to ascend to its highest level of Episcopal service in African Methodism. Bishop Sarah Davis currently serves as the presiding prelate over the 16th Episcopal District, comprised of churches and schools in South America, Windward Islands, the Caribbean Islands, Cuba and Europe. Since being assigned to the 16th Episcopal District from the Southern African 18th Episcopal District, Bishop Davis was unanimously elected to the office of Chair of the Global Development Council (GDC) of the A.M.E. Church. The GDC is responsible for the unification of all AME churches in Africa, the nations of the Caribbean, South America,

Europe, and Canada; and to promote collaboration, cohesion, and cultural integration with AME churches in the USA.

Bishop Davis is affectionately known as the "Prayer Bishop" because of her consistent emphasis on the importance of prayer in the life of the Church. She has organized numerous prayer ministries and has sponsored annual prayer conclaves in the 18<sup>th</sup> Episcopal District. Bishop Sarah was chairperson of the prayer committee for the 48<sup>th</sup> Quadrennial Session of the General Conference of the A.M.E. Church. As a result of her prayer committee leadership, the first ever Connectional Day of Prayer in African Methodism was held April 13, 2008.

Bishop Sarah is one who has experienced a number of firsts throughout her ministerial career. Prior to her Episcopal election, it had been almost a century since anyone from Texas had been elected to the office of Bishop. Bishop Sarah served for seven years as the first female pastor of the 115-year old Bethel A.M.E. Church in San Antonio, Texas having been appointed there by Bishop John R. Bryant in 1997. With this appointment, Bishop Sarah became the first woman in Texas to be appointed to a major A.M.E. Church. Also in 1997, Bishop Sarah, became the first woman in the Connectional A.M.E. Church to be appointed chair of a Board of Examiners. Ebony Magazine named Bishop Sarah as one of the 50 Most Intriguing Persons of 2004.

Bishop Sarah is well prepared and trained to perform in all areas of her life's calling having earned a Doctor of Ministry degree from Southern Methodist University Perkins School of Theology, a Master of Divinity from the Houston Graduate School of Theology, a Master of Science from New York Pace University, and a Bachelor of Arts from the University of North Texas.

Her first Episcopal assignment was to the 18th Episcopal District, comprised of the Southern African countries of Lesotho, Botswana, Swaziland, and Mozambique. She and her husband Claytie Davis, Jr., lived in Maseru, Lesotho from 2004 through 2008 while serving in Southern Africa. A staunch advocate of empowerment through education, Bishop Davis gave exemplary leadership to over 39 A.M.E. Church sponsored schools in Southern Africa. She introduced the first ever summer science and math institute program in Lesotho to globalize and develop the knowledge of students and teachers. Bishop Davis granted a record number of academic scholarships to young people, adults and clergy while in the 18th District. During her term, two clerics earned degrees in theology from universities in South Africa and Mozambique; and four earned diplomas in Theology in Botswana. For the first time, English classes were provided for Portuguese-speaking lay and clergy persons in A.M.E. Churches in Beira, Mozambique which resulted in many receiving English as Second Language (ESL) certificates.

Davis was responsible for oversight of three orphanages in Swaziland during 2004-2008. Through her leadership of the Board of Directors, the Selulasandla Village became fully operational and housed 21 orphans. In April 2008, the building of the first A.M.E. Church-sponsored orphanage was completed and dedicated in the mountains of Mokhotlong, Lesotho.

Bishop Sarah is a member of the Board of Trustees for the Houston Graduate School of Theology; serves as a member of the Jamaica Council of Churches; and is a member of the 500-member World Methodist Council (WMC) through 2011. She was appointed convener of the Strategic Planning Committee of the WMC Executive Council in Sydney, Australia in 2007, and her Committee will make its first report to the Executive Council in September 2009 in Santiago, Chile.

A much sought after preacher, teacher and workshop leader, Bishop Sarah has ministered throughout West Africa, Southern Africa, South Africa, Turkey and the Bahamas. In 2007, at the invitation of King Mswati, III of Swaziland, she was one of three clergy persons to preach at the National Easter Service of the King in Swaziland. She was the keynote preacher at the Annual General Assembly of the Lesotho Christian Council of Churches in May 2008; and she brought the message at the Ecumenical Service of the Centennial Boule of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, July 2008, in Washington, D. C. Bishop Davis is a lifetime member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

Bishop Sarah is married to Claytie Davis, Jr., a retired manager of Southwestern Bell, who now serves as the Episcopal Supervisor for the 16th Episcopal District. The Davises have two sons and a daughter-in-love: Corey B. Davis, and Dr. Claytie Davis, III, and wife Yolanda. The greatest joy for Bishop Sarah and Supervisor Davis when in the States, is spending quality time with their only grandchild, Alexandra Morgan Davis.

# Rev. Dr. Glenda F. Hodges

Rev. Dr. Glenda F. Hodges, PhD, J.D., M.Div., is the Director of the Division of Community Relations, Howard University Hospital and Assistant Professor, Department of Community and Family Medicine, Howard University College of Medicine. She is also a Lecturer/Trainer in the area of Patient Centered Decision Making: Legal Issues and End-of-Life Planning, funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. She is the Founder and CEO of Still I Rise, Inc., a community based empowerment organization

for survivors of domestic violence. She lectures extensively in this area and has done numerous workshops on domestic violence for local and state organizations. Dr. Hodges is an Ordained Itinerant Elder in the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AMEC) Second Episcopal District, where she is responsible for coordinating programs in health education at approximately 25 churches. She serves on the ministerial staff of the Reid Temple African Methodist Episcopal Church, Glen Dale, Maryland, where the Pastor is Rev. Dr. Lee P. Washington. In 2004, she was elected as a Ministerial Alternate of the Judicial Council for the African Methodist Episcopal Church. In this capacity, she serves the church on a connectional level.

Dr. Hodges has attended several colleges and universities, including Virginia State University, Howard University, Bowling Green State University, Harvard University, The District of Columbia School of Law and The University of Texas at Austin (School of Law). She holds the following degrees: B.A., M.A., PhD., J.D., and M.Div. Additionally, she has completed several short courses in Spirituality and Medicine at the Harvard Medical School's Mind Body Medical Institute.

In her position at Howard University, she oversees the following areas: Patient Relations, Pastoral Care Services, Community Outreach, Multi-Cultural Affairs, Protective Services and the Gift Shop. She chairs yearly seminars in Spirituality and Medicine, teaches a course in Spirituality and Medicine to second year medical students and divinity school students, conducts grand rounds in Spirituality and Medicine and Medical Jurisprudence for residents and interns and provides monthly lectures on Spirituality and Medicine for the Comprehensive Aids Training Institute. Additionally, she frequently testifies as an expert witness for physician defendants in matters related to medical/legal ethics. She has been featured regularly on Viewpoint, NBC 4, a televised community-interest talk-show, discussing issues related to health and wellness.

Dr. Hodges lectures extensively in Spirituality and Medicine and serves on numerous boards of Faith Based Organizations. In 2002, she was a Panelist for the Congressional Black Caucus' Braintrust concerning the Impact of Spirituality on the Health of African American Women. In June 2003, she served as a panelist on the International Call to Women for the Struggle Against Sickle Cell Disease in Paris, France, where she discussed the impact of spirituality in the treatment of sickle cell disease. In 2004, she served as an International Consultant in Cambodia for the White House Office of Faith Based Initiatives. In this capacity, she evaluated the impact of federal dollars used to fund programs where faith and spirituality where considered intervening factors in treating patients with HIV/AIDS. In 2006, she was a Consultant in Ethiopia to Ethiopian Airlines at the request of the Howard University Professional Development Leadership Academy. The Reverend Carolyn Ann Knight was born and raised in Denver, Colorado; the second daughter of the late Edd and Dorothy Knight. She received her early education in the public school system in Denver and the Bachelor of Arts degree from Bishop College in Dallas, Texas with a major concentration in English, philosophy and religion.

Her theological training began at Colgate Rochester Divinity School in Rochester, NY; she later transferred to Union Theological Seminary in New York City to study under her mentor, Dr. Cornel West. She was awarded the master of divinity degree from Union. Ms. Knight was admitted into the Ph.D. program at Drew University in Madison, New Jersey. She holds the doctor of ministry degree from the United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. In addition to these formal areas of studies, Ms. Knight pursued her interest in law and politics by attending classes at Columbia University School of Law.

During the course of her academic studies, Ms. Knight was the recipient of many scholarships and fellowships, among them the Benjamin E. Mays Fellowship for Theological Studies and the United Negro College Fund Colorado Scholarship Award. In pursuit of the Ph.D. degree, Dr. Knight was awarded a fellowship to cover all tuition costs.

Under the influence of her godfathers, the late Reverend M. C. Williams of Los Angeles, California; the late Dr. Frederick G. Sampson of Detroit, Michigan; and her Spiritual father, the late Dr. Samuel D. Proctor of New York City, Dr. Knight developed a love for preaching and the pulpit. She preached her trial sermon and was licensed for the gospel ministry at the Mount Gilead Baptist Church in Denver, Colorado under the leadership of The Reverend Acen L. Phillips. Reverend Dr. Knight has served in the pastoral ministry in pulpits in Denver, Colorado; Dallas, Texas; Rochester, and Harlem, New York. For many years she served as assistant to the pastor of the Canaan Baptist Church of Christ in Harlem where she was mentored in pastoral leadership, organizational strategy and finance by The Reverend Dr. Wyatt Tee Walker, former chief of staff to Martin Luther King Jr. She is the founder and president of "CAN DO!" Ministries; a progressive, preventive youth advocacy ministry that is dedicated to the cultural, social, intellectual, and spiritual well-being of youth and young adults. For ten years, Dr. Knight served as assistant professor of homiletics at The Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia where she had the primary responsibility for teaching and training students in the art and craft of sermonic design, development and delivery. In October of 2011, she inaugurated her vision of "The Seminary Without Walls", teaching persons who for whatever reasons may not be able to formally attend seminary classes. This inaugural event was hosted by Bishop Victor T. Curry and the New Birth Baptist Church Cathedral of Faith, International in Miami, Florida.

A preacher/pastor with scholarly interests, Reverend Knight has served as adjunct professor at LaGuardia Community College and New York Theological Seminary. She served as the permanent part-time professor of preaching at her alma mater, Union Theological Seminary in New York City. Dr. Knight has served on numerous boards and committees; among them are Harlem Congregations for Community Improvement, the Breast Examination Center of Harlem, The Black Leadership Commission on AIDS, and the advisory board of the African American Pulpit of Judson Press.

A passionate professor and preacher, she is committed to the integrity of the discipline of homiletics as a whole and particularly the best of the African American preaching tradition. In constant demand as a preacher, speaker, and evangelist, Dr. Knight has been called sui generis, a one-of-a-kind preaching voice for this generation. Cornel West says she is an "organic intellectual rooted in the best of the prophetic African American preaching tradition." She travels extensively throughout the nation speaking at churches, conferences, and on college campuses. The singular theme of her message and ministry is a better quality of life for the poor and oppressed, particularly women and children. A life-long learner, committed to the life of the mind Ms. Knight is deeply dedicated to spiritual growth, transformation and prayer. Among her spiritual disciplines are meditation, yoga, fasting and prayer walks. From the age of four, she has cultivated a life of prayer that is essential to and informs all of her activities and involvements. After many years of life and ministry Ms. Knight has found no better testament to her commitment to prayer than: "No prayer, no power. Little prayer, little power, Much prayer, nuch power!" A voracious reader, Dr. Knight enjoys reading the Classics, as well as books on history, medicine, law, philosophy, and African-American history.

In addition to her activities and responsibilities as a preacher, Reverend Dr. Knight has been signally honored for her outstanding career achievements, which include Outstanding Young Women of America; The Dunlevy-Milbank Youth Council's Community Service Award; The Mary McLeod Bethune Award of the National Council of Negro Women, Inc.; The Community Service Award from the Laurelton Chapter of the Negro Professional Business Women's Council; and the 1993 United Negro College Fund Alumni Award. In 2011, Ms. Knight was the recipient of the Trombone Award presented by the Rev. Jesse L. Jackson and the Rainbow Push Coalition to outstanding clergypersons and the President's Award from Florida Memorial University in Miami. In March 1996, Reverend Knight was inducted into the prestigious College of Preachers by Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia. She was also cited by Ebony magazine in November 1997 as one of America's 15 Greatest African American Women Preachers.

A former amateur athletic track and field champion, Dr. Knight is an avid golfer in preparation for the Mid-Amateur Women's Golf Champions. She has a variety of interests and hobbies which include reading, computer literacy, writing, music, traveling, power walking, step training, and philosophical and political discussions. Dr. Knight is a Golden Life member of


